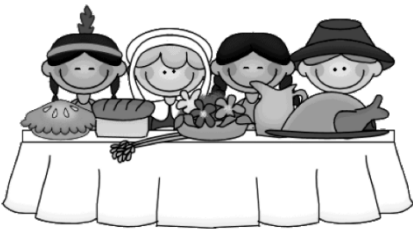

Catholic Campaign for Human Development: On November 18, the universal church will recognize the World Day of the Poor, the same weekend as our annual collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD), the national, anti-poverty campaign of the U.S. Bishops. CCHD has been an immeasurable blessing for thousands in our Archdiocese over the years. Just this past year, the agencies funded by CCHD have empowered more than 2,500 low-income people to break the cycle of poverty through such feats as finding jobs, responsibly reentering society after prison, educating youth, and securing decent housing and public services for their communities. He acclaims the widow to the disciples after he taught them that the greatest commandment is to love God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength

and to love your neighbor as yourself. There is no greater love than to lay down your life so that others can live. There is no greater love than to love without conditions and to die to selfishness. When I think of the widow's mite in this Gospel, I immediately think of St. Leo's. You have made great sacrifices of your time, talent and treasure to grow this parish, live the Gospel, to work for justice and mercy and to love God and others with all your heart, soul, mind and strength.
