- 5. What artist painted the Emmaus picture in church that used parishioners as models for Jesus and the disciples? **The late Father James Hasse, SJ**
- 6. What coincided with the silver jubilee celebration in November, 1911? **The dedication of the new church building.**
- 7. Who was the first daughter of the parish to enter the convent? **Mathilda Sitzman**, **1900**
- 8. What country in Africa are our newest parishioners from? **Burundi**
