From Fr. Jim . . .

World Mission Sunday – This weekend is World Mission Sunday. There is a special envelope in your box of envelopes for this collection and the second collection today will help support missionary activity throughout the world. The Church throughout the world needs our support. The Archdiocese of Cincinnati upon its founding in the 1800's needed the support of the greater church throughout the world and we, at St. Leo, especially understand the support and generosity of all of our brothers and sisters in Christ in order to do the Lord's work and carry-on the mission of Jesus Christ.

Through the work of lay people, religious sisters and brothers and priests, the World Mission Sunday Collection helps support, through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith: schools; hospitals, health clinics; leprosy centers; social and pastoral projects. These funds also provide operating costs for Catholic Mission Dioceses around the world. In many ways, because of the diverse nature of our parish community, we stand in strong solidarity with missionary activity throughout the world. I strongly encourage your participation in this appeal. Thank you for your generosity. May God be blessed and praised. May the Gospel be preached and lived here, throughout the United States and the entire world.

Since the obligation to attend Mass is still dispensed because of the virus, we really appreciate when you mail your envelopes to the parish or give on-line or stop by during the week to give them to us. Thanks for all the sacrifices you make to support our ministry.

A Reminder about our safety and health: As the pandemic continues and as it appears to be spiking again in Hamilton County, in order to keep gathering for liturgy we must make the necessary precautions to assure a safe and healthy environment for everyone. All the changes that we have made at St. Leo's from the very beginning are still in effect. Young children and babies are still discouraged from attending Mass. Children must always wear a mask the same as everyone else. If diapers need to be changed, please do so outside, in your car, if possible. The bathroom is to be used sparingly. The basement is still off limits. Enter church through the door with ramp and exit through the doors in front of the church. Wear masks that always cover your nose and mouth. Respect safe distancing, at least six feet. Receive communion from the side aisles and return by the center aisle. We want to avoid people having to pass each other and getting close to each other. Please follow the ushers' directions. Please continue to receive communion in your hand and not on your tongue. Only the burgundy chairs are to be used. Please do not use any other chairs like the children's chairs, the black chairs, or folding chairs. Both rooms in the back of church are off limits. The burgundy chairs are spaced at six feet. Thank you all for the extra sacrifices that you make and your cooperation to assure a safe and healthy environment for our prayer and liturgy.
