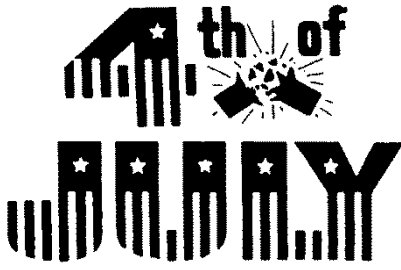

Fourth of July: This is the Fourth of July weekend. As we celebrate our country's independence, let us be mindful of all those who have fought for our rights and given their lives in service to their country and who are still fighting and sacrificing their own lives for our

independence and freedom. Let us pray for peace in our hearts, homes, cities, country and throughout the world. Isn't peace one of the greatest freedoms for the body, mind, and spirit?



Let us pray for guidance and direction in maintaining and growing the freedoms that our nation upholds and may our hearts be filled with gratitude for these freedoms. Let us pray for nations, lands and peoples who are not as free as we are free, especially places where governments are corrupt, oppressive, immoral, and unjust. Let us pray for refugees and immigrants that they can celebrate with us the freedoms that brought them to our country. Let us pray that we will be good
