22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time -August 29, 2021

From Fr. Jim . . .

I can remember when I was a child, growing up and attending Sunday Mass with my parents, leaving Mass a little early before Mass was over was a common occurrence. People had different reasons for leaving Mass early but one reason was to get to your car and drive out of the parking lot without incident. The lot was always crowded and then people needed to enter it and find a parking space before the next Mass started. Horns were honking and people didn't always say kind things to each other, and people didn't always treat each other as Christians. I can also remember that some Protestant faiths considered Catholics to be hypocrites because we would say and do one thing in church on Sunday and then say and do the opposite in the parking lot.

Jesus quotes the Prophet Isaiah to the Pharisees when he says: "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts." We cannot pay "lip service" to the Law without loving God with the heart. And Saint James tells us to "welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your soul." He also says, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves." We are deeply connected to God's Word in such a way that to hear the Word without living it out would be to wither on a tree or to dry up and crack as desert soil.

Pope Francis urges his brother priests to go out as shepherds where there is suffering and brokenness so that they have the "odor of the sheep." The Word of Truth calls all of us to be "doers of the word and not hearers only" and to care for the most vulnerable in our midst. How is the Word of God that you just heard calling you into action when you leave Mass today? From the church to the parking lot, to where? To whom?


