21st Sunday of Ordinary Time – August 21, 2022

From Father Rudy

Gospel: Luke: 12: Luke 13: 22-30 Narrow Gate.

What does it mean to be in a relationship? At first glance, you might think only of the romantic kind, yet its more accurate meaning is any association or connection between people—whether it is intimate, platonic, positive or negative. In a secular sense, there are many types of relationships, such as with family, friends, acquaintances, teacher/student, work, or other variations. Also, how deep your relationship is with another person is connected to your level of involvement and commitment. As humans, our connections to other people are critical to our happiness and often define the trajectory of our lives.

As important as our human relationships are, our relationship with our Lord surpasses all of them, yet often we put God on the back burner and go through the motions of our faith. For example, because we are busy pursuing other relationships or are engrossed in other pursuits, we might concentrate on our faith for just an hour or so each week to fulfill our Sunday obligation. Imagine spending so few dedicated moments when we truly desire something or someone in our lives and then refer to this yearning as an obligation!

It is the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, and in today's Gospel, Jesus, when questioned, describes a "narrow door" for gaining entrance into Heaven. Jesus' message in this Gospel is surprising, since many of us believe that all paths lead to heaven if we have faith, are good people, go to church, and follow the rules. Jesus tells us, however, that it takes thought, discipline, and effort to go through this "door," and we must have depth and breadth in a rooted relationship with Him. St Gregory Nazianzus has said "It is more important that we should remember God than that we should breathe..." and for many of us, what we perceive as our best efforts may indeed be insufficient.

According to Pope Benedict XVI, "True friendship with Jesus is expressed in the way of life: it is expressed with goodness of heart, with humility, meekness and mercy, love for justice and truth, a sincere and honest commitment to peace and reconciliation. This, we might say, is the "identity card" that qualifies us as 'true friends'—it is the true passport that will let us enter eternal life."


