24th Sunday of Ordinary Time -September 11, 2022

My Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord,

The story of the Prodigal Son is one of the most well-known parables in Scripture, the third of a trilogy of parables in today's Gospel in which Jesus shows us the power of recovery, redemption, and God's enduring mercy. Each parable represents God's endless quest to bring even one lost soul back to His loving arms, and heaven's exultation upon the return. No one is forgotten, no one is beyond pardon, no one is alone.

It is the Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, and we are again blessed to realize that God is always with us, no matter how we may falter, reject, or forget His unconditional love for us. We may return to Him at any time, circumstance, or manner of choosing. Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd who relentlessly will "find" us, no matter how far we have strayed. He will guide us back, joyfully, to the fold and help us through any duress or dark days ahead.

In 1772, the Anglican clergyman and poet John Newton composed a gorgeous poem/hymn, known as his spiritual autobiography, "Amazing Grace," that many of us find surprisingly inspirational and life-affirming; people seem to stop in their tracks when they hear its haunting melody and beautiful words of God's forgiveness and mercy. It is an immensely popular hymn, particularly in the United States, where it is used for both religious and secular purposes.

I ask you to consider Newton's words as we ponder its significance for our own lives today:

"Amazing grace how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now I'm found, was blind, but now I see. 'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, and grace my fears relieved; how precious did that grace appear, the hour I first believed! Through many dangers, toils, and snares, I have already come; 'tis grace has brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home. The Lord has promised good to me, his word my hope secures; he will my shield and portion be as long as life endures. Yes, when this flesh and heart shall fail, and mortal life shall cease; I shall possess, within the veil, a life of joy and peace. The earth shall soon dissolve like snow, the sun forbear to shine; but God, who called me here below, will be forever mine. "


