30th Sunday of Ordinary Time -October 23, 2022

My Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord,

It is the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, and today is also designated World Mission Sunday, which is held each year on the second to last Sunday in October. Mission Sunday has a long and exceptional history of celebrating Catholic's universal support and enthusiasm for missionaries, whose dedicated efforts help to evangelize and spread the Good News across the entire globe. Begun by Pope Pius XI in 1926, and organized by the Propagation of the Faith, this day is set aside for Catholics everywhere to recommit themselves to the Church's missionary work through their prayer and sacrifice.

According to The Catholic Telegraph, "across the world, and especially in the rapidly growing Church in Africa and Asia, the young faith community urgently needs support, just as the Archdiocese did, upon its founding in the 1800s." Today's Mission Sunday collection is used to support thousands of schools, hospitals, health clinics, leprosy centers, social/pastoral projects, and nearly 1,200 Catholic mission dioceses throughout the world.

As a missionary in Africa for many years, I am grateful to the spirit of this celebration, and I know first-hand many hundreds, if not thousands, of individuals who been helped by the funds collected on this special day. It has made a huge difference to what we can do to help our friends in need in the most remote areas of the world, as well as to offer them tools toward a faith-filled life. It also teaches us, in making this contribution, how giving is inherent to our spirituality and connection to our Lord. As St Francis of Assisi said with these inspiring words: "For it is in giving that we receive;" and each of us, in our own way, has experienced the joy in such actions. Let us be generous today.

The most obvious lesson in Christ's teaching is that there is no happiness in having or getting anything, but only in giving. --Henry Drummond, evangelist, biologist, writer and lecturer.
