From Fr. Jim . . .

Reflection on the Eucharist: This Sunday is the second of five weeks that we will hear from the Bread of Life discourse in the Gospel of John. The following reflection on the Eucharist is taken from Pope Benedict XVI, General Audience, December 10, 2008.

“The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the Blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the Body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread (1Cor. 10:16-17).” In these words, the social and personal character of the Sacrament of the Eucharist likewise appears. Christ personally unites himself with each one of us, but Christ himself is also united with the man and the woman who are next to me. And the bread is for me, but it is also for the other. Thus, Christ unites all of us with himself and all of us with one another. In communion we receive Christ. But Christ is likewise united with my neighbor: Christ and my neighbor are inseparable in the Eucharist. And thus, we are all one bread and one body. A Eucharist without solidarity with others is a Eucharist abused. And here we come to the root and, at the same time, the kernel of the doctrine on the Church as the Body of Christ, of the Risen Christ”.

It strikes me that Christ has truly died and risen for everyone and how important it is when we accept this and appreciate it. Then we can celebrate our union with Christ and with each other and live under the title of the Body of Christ. It also strikes me that it will take “the many” to convey this to “the rest of all” to help them see and appreciate their union with God and God’s people.

The Bread of Life Discourse was truly Good News for the people in the days of the early church. Today, as we face many things, attitudes and positions that want to divide us into groups of “either/or” and “us and them”, the call to unity in diversity as the Body of Christ and treating everyone as a brother or sister and being Eucharist for all others is still the Good News that will pass the test of time and in every place and all generations. Lord, thank you for the gift of Eucharist. Please help our unbelief and teach us to follow your great commandment of love now and always.
