**From Fr. Jim . . .**

**Lent is coming.** This Wednesday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> is Ash Wednesday. With the markings of an ash cross on our foreheads and the words, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel," the holy season of Lent begins. Please join us for the celebration of the Eucharist with reception of ashes at 7:00 pm.

Lent is a time for renewal and conversion. The Scripture for Ash Wednesday reminds us that traditionally it is through prayer, fasting and almsgiving or acts of charity that renewal and conversion can happen. With this in mind, Catholic Christians usually ask themselves this question, "What will I do for Lent this year specifically through acts of charity, prayer and fasting that will allow me to live my faith more fully and closer in union with God's life, love and grace? This happens individually and communally.

Lent is also a time to journey with the Elect – those who have not been baptized (catechumens) and who are seeking baptism at the Easter Vigil. It is a time to journey with those who have been baptized in other Christian faiths (candidates) and who want full communion with the Catholic faith through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. At St. Leo, there is one candidate for full communion and St. Boniface, there is a group of catechumens and candidates. Also, in both parishes, there are groups of baptized Catholics who are preparing to receive the Sacraments of first Eucharist and/or Confirmation sometime during the Easter Season. Lent is a time for all of us to grow in the faith and prepare to commit to a life of faith or prepare to renew our commitment. Please check the bulletin for additional prayer times during Lent and suggestions for fasting and almsgiving. Whatever we choose to do during this holy season, may we grow closer to the Lord and to each other and learn to live more fully in his image and likeness.
