You may recall an occasion as a small child when an older adult publicly urged you to utter a term of gratitude after receiving a gift or compliment of some kind. What do you say, Bobbie, for that nice gift from Grandma? Instinctively, you knew what to say to Grandma, because it was drummed into your brain so many times, but at that age, you could not fully grasp why it was so important to be grateful to another person. Later, as you matured, grew in empathy, and lost some self-centeredness, you began to see why indeed it is important to appreciate the gifts you receive.

Taking this thought a step further, we sometimes fail to remember every gift we receive in life is from our Lord, and often we take for granted his love, mercy, and benevolence. Yes, we always send that thank-you note or email out for the flowers or birthday gift, but do we raise our eyes to heaven to thank God for our wonderful life and all the many gifts we have been given? Not only should we be overwhelmed with the beauty of the earth--the blue sky and deep seas, but also with our own treasures, talents, and life experiences that are as unique as we all are.

It is the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary time, and in Luke's Gospel today, Jesus, who is travelling between Samaria and Galilee on his way to Jerusalem, heals ten lepers who are at a distance from him. The lepers depart, and only one of them, a Samaritan, returns to give glory and thanks to Jesus. He recovers from his leprosy, yet it is "his faith that [makes] him whole." (Lk. 17:19) With new eyes, this man transcends his illness, and in perfect praise, thanks God for His mercy and blessing.

I urge you to start, end, and review each day with gratitude and be aware of God's presence in your life. He is not there just to hear your prayer in trying times, but *in all times*—good days, bad days, or insignificant ones; he walks with you and can transform you in the most glorious way.
