Several more are close to taking their citizenship tests and learning English is a big step in the process, It's hard work but both they and their ESL teachers are determined and all celebrate when they have achieved their goal.

Though they are proud to be US citizens, the refugees never forget their home country which is now experiencing violence and political turmoil. They worry about family members still there and pray for peace. Cell phones and email help keep them connected. They make sure their children know their relatives in Africa and try to pass the values and traditions of their homeland.
